The Food and Drug Administration intends to obtain the services of the governments of federally-recognized Tribes to assist in conducting tobacco retail inspections within their tribal boundaries.

Any interested party should submit a statement of capabilities demonstrating their previous experience performing similar inspection work and their capability to employ commissionable inspectors to conduct the inspection.

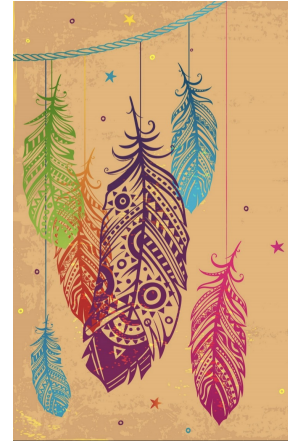
