Media Invited to 10 Year Anniversary Celebration of the Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act

Celebration Continues Fight to Reduce Toll from Tobacco

The New Mexico Allied Council on Tobacco (NMACT) is holding a 10-year anniversary celebration to recognize a decade of progress in the quest for cleaner, healthier air in New Mexico, free from the harmful effects of secondhand smoke. The Council includes the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN), American Heart Association, American Lung Association, New Mexico Cancer Center, Keres Consulting and Nuestra Salud, among numerous other local and national partners.

It was in 2007 that the Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act was passed by the state Legislature and signed into law. The 10 Year Anniversary event is sponsored by NMACT and the Chronic Disease Prevention Council and will be held at noon on June 15, 2017 at the Marble Brewery in Downtown Albuquerque.

The Dee Johnson Clean Indoor Air Act prohibits smoking in indoor public places and workplaces including restaurants, bars and nightclubs. New Mexico's Clean Indoor Act was named after the late first lady of New Mexico Dee Johnson, in honor of her successful fight to ban smoking in the state Capitol. Starting in 1994, she faced off with the tobacco industry and legislative leadership, many of whom smoked, in her efforts to prohibit smoking inside the roundhouse. In 2002, after a seven-year fight, the Capitol became smoke-free.

Smoking costs New Mexico \$844 million each year in direct health care costs, kills 2,630 New Mexicans annually, and 78,000 people suffer with at least one serious illness from smoking. Tobacco-free workplaces and public places protect workers from secondhand smoke and support workers and patrons who are trying to quit tobacco.
