National Minority Health Month

April is <u>National Minority Health Month (NMHM)</u>, a time to raise awareness about health disparities that continue to affect people from racial and ethnic minority groups and encourage action through health education, early detection, and control of disease complications. This year's theme is Better Health Through Better Understanding and focuses on improving health outcomes by providing culturally and linguistically appropriate information.

NMHM offers a good time to reflect if your community offers culturally appropriate commercial tobacco education. Many commercial tobacco prevention and cessation resources may focus on non-Indigenous populations, neglecting the sacred relationship between traditional tobacco and many Tribes.

Here are some great culturally significant resources to consider:

<u>Smoke Free Signals</u> – Smoke Free Signals was established in 2015 to serve NM Indigenous communities and promote secondhand smoke protections through education, outreach, and policy support. Our website offers culturally tailored presentations, educational videos, infographics, toolkits, newsletters and more.

<u>National Native Network: Keep It Sacred</u> – This website offers a wide range of educational references for tobacco, tradition, and beyond. Included in its resources are also archived webinars, newsletters, podcasts, and toolkits to help serve in your educational efforts.

<u>Next Legends Campaign by the FDA</u> – Next Legends primarily a digital-based effort to reach AIAN youth, ages 12-17 who are at risk for using e-cigarettes. The website has social media posts you can use, fact sheets, research, and quitting resources.

<u>American Indian Commercial Tobacco Program</u> – Launched in 2015, this program supports American Indians quit commercial tobacco for good, while preserving the tradition of sacred tobacco, with three options including phone + online coaching, phone coaching only, or online coaching only.

Smoke Free Signals Initiatives

The Smoke Free Signals (SFS) program has provided commercial tobacco, secondhand smoke, and secondhand aerosol education and resources to New Mexico Tribal communities, with a goal to improve health outcomes and eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke. As an initiative, SFS developed the Traditional Tobacco Education and Awareness campaign involving the development of custom designed materials. The materials were tailored to the unique Indigenous groups in New Mexico to share awareness of the sacred use of tobacco by Tribal communities through resources and educational materials.



To continue the progress and effort of educating and sharing awareness of the traditional use of tobacco, SFS has implemented a mass-reach health communication intervention campaign. The purpose of the campaign is to spread awareness about the sacred use of traditional tobacco as a protective factor and the danger of commercial tobacco use and secondhand smoke, while recognizing the cultural continuance of New Mexico Indigenous communities.
