What Does Smoking Do To Your Heart?

With **February** being **HEART** month take care of yours by exploring these helpful tips!

Currently, smoking is still the #1 cause of preventable disease and death in the United States. Because cigarette smoke contains more than 7,000 chemical it creates certain complications for the user. When a person smokes, the chemicals mix with the blood and the contaminated substance is distributed throughout the body. This is particularly toxic for your heart and blood vessels. Over time this can lead to cardiovascular disease (CVD).

What is CVD?

This term refers to a menu of complications that affect the heart or blood vessels, including:

- coronary heart disease
- high blood pressure
- heart attacks
- stroke

How can you protect yourself and others?

The best way to protect yourself and others is not to smoke or encourage users to quit smoking. Listed below are numerous benefits from **staying smoke free**:

- In as little at 20 minutes after, you guit smoking your heart rate drops
- After 12 hours quitting smoking the carbon monoxide level in your blood drops to normal
- After 4 years of quitting your risk of a stroke drops

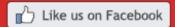
