Are Your Pets Exposed to Secondhand Smoke?

Pets can be an amazing component to families. For some tribal communities, pets are seen as gifts and are part of the family. It's important that families do what they can to protect their loved ones and pets from the exposure of secondhand smoke. If millions of people are exposed to smoke in their homes or vehicles, imagine how many pets are too. Just like children, indoor pets are at risk to developing diseases, such as heart disease, lung and nose cancer, and asthma.

Why is Smoking Harmful to Your Pets?

Did you know that there are over 7,000 chemicals released from burned cigarettes? Ninety-three of these known chemicals are listed on the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's list of "Harmful and Potentially Harmful Constituents in Tobacco Products and **Tobacco Smoke**." Some of these chemicals include: ammonia, arsenic, benzene, lead, and mercury. Children and pets are near the floor much of the time which can be dangerous for them if smoking occurs in the home due to secondhand smoke setting. Secondhand smoke, which contains hundreds of chemicals, stick to furniture, clothing, carpet, and furniture. These high-touch areas can be dangerous for your pet.



Prevent Pet Smoke Exposure By:

- ♦ Not smoking in your home or vehicle
- ♦ If smoking, do not let your pet lick your hands
- ♦ Clean your house regularly, to prevent nose flares in dogs
- Wash your pets frequently, to remove smoke particles in your pet's fur
- ♦ Do not leave your pet's water bowl to sit out (Nicotine particles dissolve easily in water)


